From the Desk of Town Supervisor (Pat Flynn):

- The engineering firm, CPL, has finalized drawings for WD 1
- Easements necessary for WD1 have been reviewed by the Town Attorney and sent to the affected homeowners
- Negotiations with Norfolk Southern for easements under their tracks are ongoing

From the Desk of the Town Board:

- The Town Board meets the second Tuesday of the month at 7:30pm
- Continues to work on a contract with the Village of Dresden to supply water to Town of Torrey Water District 2 (WD2)
- **Grievance Day** is **Thursday, May 28,2020.** Contact the Town Assessor for the details of how, when, and where.

From the Desk of Town Clerk (Betty Daggett):

- Town Office is open Monday through Thursday from 9:00am 4:00pm. Although, the office is closed until the COVID-19 restrictions are lifted! Call 315-536- 6376 for essential business.
- Fee collection such as building permits, fines & fees issued by Code Office
- Licenses : marriage, hunting, fishing, dog & birth/death certificates (If you love your dog(s), please license them. Licensing helps with Identification of lost dogs and provides protection for the community. It is also NYS Ag & Market law- ALL dogs harbored in the Town of Torrey must be licensed yearly

at the Town Clerk office).

- The Summer Recreation program will run from July 1 - August 14

From the Desk of Town Highway Superintendent (*Tim Chambers*):

- Off hours emergency callout number: 315-729-2706
- Consolidated Local and Highway Improvement Projects (CHIPs) funds (approximately \$65,000 in previous years) may be reduced causing a review of previous planned paving ,stone, or oil of several roads throughout the Town
- Snow removal season has ended so the highway department has now turned to Spring tasks- patching potholes, mowing roadsides, sweeping roads, drainage work, etc.
- Torrey Cleanup Days is tentatively scheduled to be held August 15th from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm (see more details under Upcoming Community Events)
- *Reminder according to NYS law:*
 - + throwing trash, garbage, rubbish, litter or refuse on Highways and adjacent lands is <u>prohibited</u>
 - the town superintendent of highways shall sue for and recover a penalty not to exceed \$100 from any person depositing ashes, snow, ice, stones, sticks, etc. upon a hwy or on grass or loose stones adjoining a town hwy

From the Desk of Town Code Enforcement Officer (Dwight James):

- Call the Town Office at 315-536-6376 (cell 315-730-3291) or email at <u>torreycodes@gmail.com</u> to inquire about Permits. When in doubt ask!
- The new New York State Building Code took effect on May 12, 2020. Check with Dwight for additional information
- Building permits are required for any electrical, plumbing, insulation, or structural work undertaken
- Construction or alteration of any accessory structure, addition or new construction requires a permit

- Reminder all short term rentals must be registered with the Town

From the Desk of Town Planning Board (Dave Granzin):

- Meets the third (3rd) Monday of the month at 7:00 pm in the Town Building although at this time COVID-19 restrictions have forced cancellation of recent meetings
- An item on the agenda is a review of dog kennel laws

From the Desk of Town Judge (Hon. George Thompson)

- Court is held each Tuesday at 2:00pm on the West side of the Town Building. The phone number is 315 536 5655
- Criminal court is held the second Tuesday of the month at 2:00 pm

From the Desk of Town Watershed Inspector (*Yates Cty Soil & Water***)** The Town's inspectors can be contacted at the Yates County Soil and Water Conservation Department 315- 536-5188.

In November of 2014, the Town of Torrey passed a local Wastewater Law effective January 1, 2015. Under the new law, any onsite wastewater treatment system within 200' of Seneca Lake or a DEC classified stream is required to be inspected every 5 years. The cost of the inspection is borne by the Town of Torrey (unless this is a property transfer). However any pumping of the septic or repair is a cost to the homeowner. We are now in year 6 of these inspections.

- The public hearing for the Village Budget was held in April via teleconferencing. The tax rate is below the New York State Tax Cap.
- Village Election scheduled for March have been postponed to late Summer
- A date for the "Dresden Days" celebration is uncertain at this time because of COVID-19 restrictions.
- There is a need for volunteer firemen in Dresden. All residents of the Town of Torrey are encouraged to volunteer.

- Seneca Lake Pure Waters Association (SLPWA) stream sampling in the Keuka Outlet began May 11th. Sampling is not as robust as in previous years as it is now done in conjunction with the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). Harmful Algal Blooms (HABs) monitoring will start in early August 5 and will continue through the beginning of October.
