The 2021 total Town Tax Levy represents a 4.90% increase of the 2020 Town Tax Levy mainly due to the fallout from the Pandemic

- Adopted on December 8, 2020 Water District 1 Bond Resolution to finance the Capital Improvements

- A lawsuit regarding the Greenidge Data Center has been served on the Town Board, Planning Board, and Greenidge
- Because of the COVID-19 surge and the possibility of inclement weather, the regular monthly Town meetings of February 9th and March 9th may be held in the basement of Dresden Methodist Church, 60 Cornelia Street, at 7:30 pm.
- A special public Town meeting will be held at the Dresden Methodist Church on January 26th at 7:00 pm with the Town of Milo regarding an annexation of property to the Town of Torrey. This will be followed by at 7:30 pm with a review of the status of the Torrey Water District 1 and Water District 2

From the Desk of Town Clerk (Betty Daggett):

- Town Office is open Monday through Thursday from 9:00am 4:00pm. Call 315-536- 6376
- Notary Public available- NoFee
- Tax Collection is in full stride, the new collection system introduced by the county in 2018 was plagued with glitches, the problems have been resolved, and the 2020 tax collection is running smoothly.
- This year, on the tax bills is the option to pay Town & County Taxes online at <u>https://www.yatescounty.org/519</u>, - standard processing fees will be applied.
- Fee collection such as building permits, fines & fees issued by Code Office, Watershed Inspection for property sales
- Registrar of Birth / Death Certificates Vital copies \$10.00 fee.
- Handicap Parking Permits
- Hunting / Fishing Licenses are now for sale
- Marriage License Requirements: Bride/Groom/Spouse must be present to obtain a license. The license is good for 60 days. There is a \$30 fee. Evening or Saturday appointments are available.

 Dog Licenses: State Law requires all puppies to be licensed at 4 months. At time of licensing, a rabies certificate and neuter/spay certificate must be presented. Licensing Fees: Unspayed/Unneutered \$18 and Spayed/Neutered \$10.

(It is NYS Ag & Market law- **ALL dogs** harbored in the Town of Torrey must be licensed yearly at the Town Clerk office)

From the Desk of Town Highway Superintendent (Tim Chambers):

- Off hours emergency callout number: 315-729-2706
- Replaced the septic tank and distribution box at the Torrey Town park
- Tires on the 2001 Backhoe need to be replaced
- Gear box on the 2019 brush mower which is attached to the 2006 excavator must be repaired or replaced
- 2006 pickup truck with 114,000 miles will be put up for auction
- Hometowne Fuel now has the Yates County fuel bid
- As a safety precaution, especially this time of year when snow plowing is possible, trash cans should not be placed on Town Roads, but rather on the right-of-way.
- *Reminder according to NYS law:*
 - + throwing trash, garbage, rubbish, litter or refuse on Highways and adjacent lands is <u>prohibited</u>
 - the town superintendent of highways shall sue for and recover a penalty not to exceed \$100 from any person depositing ashes, snow, ice, stones, sticks, etc. upon a highway or on grass or loose stones adjoining a town highway

From the Desk of Town Code Enforcement Officer (Dwight James):

- Total Permits issued for 2020 were 89
- Permit fees collected for 2020 were \$8591.60
- Total inspections for 2020 were 61

- Total variances for 2020 were 12
- Total violations issued in 2020 were 19 with 13 being resolved
- Total C of O/C of C for 2020 were 17
 Reminder all short term rentals must be registered with the Town
- Answered a call from the Yates County Sheriff Department about an incident of "social distancing" **not** being observed. Everyone is encouraged to wear a mask, wash hands regularly, and practice social distancing during this pandemic!

From the Desk of Town Planning Board (Dave Granzin):

- Meets the third (3rd) Monday of the month at 7:00 pm in the Town Building
- Processed several standard site plan reviews, lot line adjustments, and variance requests, some of which were forwarded to the Zoning Board of Appeals.
- The Planning Board was the lead agency in the SEQR process regarding Greenidge's application for a Data Farm on its existing site. The Planning Board established November 7,2020 for the receiving of public comments on the proposed project. Some three hundred twenty two (322) comments from the public were received and reviewed by the Planning Board to which they responded in a statement. The comment forms expressed concerns about impacts to Seneca Lake and impacts with regard to climate change. However, during its analysis of potential impacts on Part 2 of the Environmental Assessment Form, the Planning Board found that there would be no impacts on surface water, including Seneca Lake, and no impacts on climate change. The Applicant holds valid permits from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation with respect to air emissions and water discharges, is operating in compliance with

those permits, and will continue to operate in compliance with those permits even after completion of the Project.

The Planning Board also noted the comment forms did not raise any issues that identify potentially significant environmental impacts that were not considered by the Planning Board during its SEQRA review or provide substantive information regarding the inadequacy of the proposed mitigation measures. The Town has also received a copy of correspondence from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation noting that there is no basis to reopen any of the Applicant's (Greenidge) existing permits.

- At the November 14,2020 Planning Board meeting approved the site plan for a data farm with a conditional negative SEQR declaration. The three (3) conditions for approval are
 - Power will be generated onsite for the data farm and not to be drawn from the grid
 - A noise level test will be conducted to measure any increase in noise due to the new operation. If the additional noise exceeds the zoning code limit of 50 dB, the facility will not be allowed to operate
 - Applicant will fulfill all DEC requirements relative to the Greenidge Generation operations
- The Town Board at the request of the Planning Board passed a six
 (6) month moratorium on the seeking of establishing dog kennels
 In the Town. The time will be used to review Planning Board
 regulations for dog kennels.
- The Planning Board is reviewing three (3) Solar Farm projects in the town.

From the Desk of Town Judge (Hon. George Thompson)

- Court is held each Tuesday at 2:00pm on the West side of the Town Building. The phone number is 315 536 5655

- Criminal court is held the second Tuesday of the month at 2:00 pm
- Town Board members Grant Downs and Larry Martin audited the Town Justice books and found no discrepancies for Judge George R. Thompson, September 1, 2019 - August 31,2020
- Town Court is applying for a **JCAP** Grant to finance installation of a Security system for the building and courtroom.

From the Desk of Town Watershed Inspector (*Yates Cty Soil & Water***)** The Town's inspectors can be contacted at the Yates County Soil and Water Conservation Department 315- 536-5188.

In November of 2014, the Town of Torrey passed a local Wastewater Law effective January 1, 2015. Under the new law, any onsite wastewater treatment system within 200' of Seneca Lake or a DEC classified stream is required to be inspected every 5 years. The cost of the inspection is borne by the Town of Torrey (unless this is a property transfer). However any pumping of the septic or repair is a cost to the homeowner. We are now in year 6 of these inspections.

- Seneca Lake Pure Waters Association (SLPWA)

Stream sampling along the Keuka Outlet continued in 2020 in conjunction with the Department of Environmental Conservation. There were only a couple of sampling events taken because of budget considerations. Harmful Algal Bloom (**HABS**) monitoring continued this Summer under the direction of Bill Roege of Benton. The results were quite different from previous years despite a hot and dry Summer. There were only a few localized events on Seneca Lake especially along the Town of Torrey shoreline. A dock monitoring and sampling experiment initiated in 2019 was continued in 2020 and proved very promising. It demonstrated we can find more blooms than with just volunteers and that there is significant nutrient variation along the shoreline. A toxin field test kit that homeowners could use to test their own for the presence of HABS based toxins was tested Check their website <u>www.SenecaLake.org</u> for additional Information or to volunteer!
